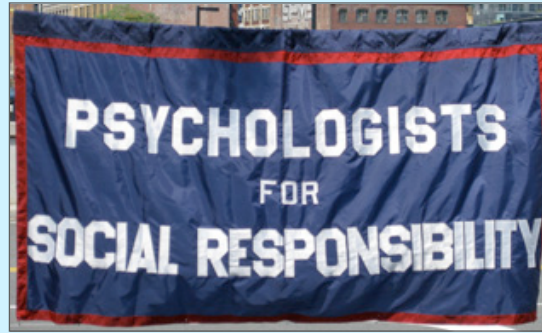
**Workshop 1 — “Transforming Our Own Psyches”** — will explore experientially the core psychological principles and group processes for moving from paralysis to effective group action for sustainable social change (offered Friday and Saturday).

**Workshop 2 — “Confronting Eco-Anxieties & Promoting A Healthy Eco-Identity in Clinical & Academic Work”** — will include discussions and experiential exercises for converting anxiety to energy for change.

**Workshop 3 — “After Toronto: Going Forth As Committed Activists”** — will include practice in small group processes and dialogue, and guidelines for facilitating community-based climate activism.

**Individuals may attend Workshops 2 or 3 even if they miss a preceding workshop.**

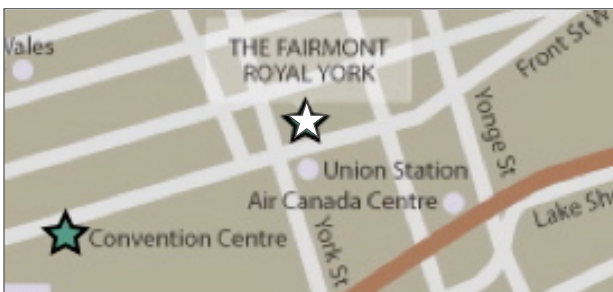
